# IS PICTURE FRAMING REALLY A PROFESSION- OR JUST A HOBBY?

Recently, I read a letter to the Editor of Picture Framing Magazine from Stephen Hendrick from Arizona. The tone of his letter was that picture framing is so easily entered and departed by hobbyists that it will never have the status of being a profession and those of us working in the field should not be considered as professionals.

I immediately took offense of course, but then in a way he has a point. The Webster Dictionary defines a profession as "a vocation or occupation requiring advanced education and training, and involving intellectual skills, such as medicine, law, theology, engineering, teaching, etc.". Picture framing doesn't require the education level of engineering nor the training of a surgeon nor the convoluted intellectual skills of a lawyer, so does not meet the technical requirements of a "profession".

However, that does not mean we can't be professionals. If Mr. Hendrick had read the definition of 'professional" he would have found that Webster includes "engaged in a specified occupation for pay or as a means of livelihood (a professional writer)" also "a person who does something with great skill". I know many of us that meet those definitions of a professional and, contrary to Mr. Hendrick's opinion, should be considered as such. Which does bring up another question: at what point do we become professionals?

Apprentice they were paid little or nothing for the privilege of learning a livelihood. Only when they learned enough to become Journeymen were they able to start charging for their work, in other words, become a professional .As they became more experienced and knowledgeable they earned the title of Master. In order to move up they had to demonstrate their skills. Each trade had their own minimum requirements and timetables.

Currently, the only equivalent demonstration in the framing trade would be the CPF exam given by PPFA. To me, passing this test proves you are in the Journeyman level of picture framing, and as such a professional framer. In fact, wanting to prove you are a professional is the only conceivable reason for taking the test. Of course, there are those who have not nor have any intention of taking the CPF exam and are every bit as professional as a CPF. So what defines a professional framer?

A possible definition: A professional framer is one who can educate the customer in what is the best way to preserve their artwork (if applicable), then design, quote, and produce a quality product that exceeds the customer's expectations, and do it in reasonable amount of time with whatever tools are at his disposal.

Preserving their artwork: A professional should be conversant with conservation techniques and know when to use them and be able to explain them clearly to the customer.

**Design:** All framers should be able to design a basic but tasteful frame job. A professional should be able to handle nearly anything that comes through the door.

Quote: Be able to price a project with whatever price list the shop is using. Or if that is not possible, at least be able to give an estimate that will cover costs and give the shop a profit.

Quality product: A product that meets or exceeds the minimum requirements of the shop the professional is working in.

Reasonable amount of time: It is not reasonable for taking an hour to cut a simple mat under any circumstances, but what is reasonable will vary depending on the equipment and arrangement of the shop.

Whatever tools: In my opinion, a professional should be familiar with all tools of the trade and yet able to produce a product with only the basic tools (mat cutter, vise, press, etc.). A more advanced professional would have to be able to safely use production equipment (v-nailers, double miter saws, combination presses, power hand tools of all sorts, etc.).

You'll notice I don't include any business knowledge or management skills in my definition. This is on purpose. I am trying to define a professional framer not a business owner nor manager. That is a whole different profession.
