THE JUNE TRICKS

The June meeting about tricks of the trade began with an animated discussion of filling nail holes in frames. Framers shared how putty, the traditional hole filler, can be blended by heating the putty in a microwave in a microwave able container. Putty can be easily applied and worked into cracks using rubber tipped clay working tools. Excess putty can be swept out of weathered or rough surfaces by using an old oil painting brush with the bristles cut short. Other framers shared their enthusiasm for spackle as a hole filler. The spackle is painted with acrylic paint that is mixed on a piece of scrap glass held over the frame so that the paint can be easily matched to the frame.

After filling corners, suggestions were made for getting good cuts, coloring the edge before joining, having pre-made frame and mat combinations, and using store art to (Continued on page 3)



help customers envision what will be done with their pictures. Conservation then turned to general business attitudes and determining what you want your business to be. Framers felt that it was important no t to prejudge the customer or the art, and to focus on the best framing design for the piece. It was also important to be aware that not every piece a customer brings in requires top of the line framing.

Pricing issues, always a popular topic, were brought up. About half of the framers were computerized at point of sale, but all framers were using computers to generate some information used in the business, whether in the form of charts, customer files, bookkeeping, signage, etc. Some framers expresses that well designed pricing charts were fast, accurate, and not difficult to update, while others felt their point of sale computer software was the equivalent of half an employee. The 1999 EPFG pricing survey results, handed out at the May meeting, is often the catalyst for a business to review its pricing and business plan. In the May issue of Décor, page 132 – 137, Rob Markoff, CPF, write about preparing a business plan in a simple to follow format. Check it out!






